Frequently Asked Questions

What is the student to monitor/teacher ratio?

We work on a ratio of 1 monitor/teacher for every 20 campers.

Are there any other additional costs we need to consider?

The main costs of the camp are entirely covered, there is no need for your child to bring money to school to pay for any other activity

How many children are in each language class?

Language classes are limited to 20 students; however we try to keep them to 1:10 by splitting the group into two sub-groups if numbers are high. In this way whilst one sub-group of pupils is learning English, the other group will be enjoying a more practical session with a monitor.

Which language will the students speak during the program?

The aim of the camp is to develop a child's ability to use the English language so this will be the main language in use. Many of our staff are bilingual so will also be able to communicate with your child in Spanish should it be necessary.

Can my child bring their own snacks?

There is no need to your child to bring their own snack as this is included in the cost of the camp. Should your child have a specific dietary requirement please ensure you inform us of that well in advance of your child's start date with us.

What should my camper bring to day camp?

Each day campers should bring the following items in a backpack: filled water bottle, sunscreen and any other form of sun protection. Materials are provided as part of the camp fees.

Can my child bring electronic devices?

It is not recommended that students bring a mobile phone, but if they do, it cannot be used during the camp. This is for safeguarding reasons and if your child is caught using his/her phone it will be confiscated for the remainder of the day. Other devices such as iPads/iPods, laptops etc are prohibited.

How will the language level be established? Is it necessary to take a test?

Although students do not take any traditional tests, their daily progress is monitored through verbal presentations and project demonstrations. Groups will be formed according to level and age (beginners, intermediate and advanced), with written/oral tests on the first two days of the course. Each student will receive a Student Report at the end of their stay with us.

Is it possible for my child to participate if he or she is not a student at King's College?

Yes, students from other schools are welcome to attend our Summer School. We encourage the international sharing of experiences.
